

## HEALTH & SAFETY STATEMENT

The practice recognises its statutory obligations to ensure, so far as reasonably practicable, the health, safety and welfare at work of all its employees and to safeguard the health and safety of the public and visitors who may be affected by their operations. The practice aims are to;

All employees shall have particular regard to the Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2007, issued under Section 16(1) of this Act.
- The Designated Members will be responsible for the implementation of the Health and Safety Statement, which will be brought to the attention of all employees.
